Daytime Camps, Skills Classes and Two Week Major Productions

Half of Tuition is due upon enrollment with the balance due May 1. There is a 15% discount for registering more than one child or registering for more than one class. Tuition is non-refundable unless PCT is notified in writing one month before classes begin. If notified, tuition, minus a \$35 non-refundable registration fee, will be held on account for use towards future classes and productions.

Before camp and after camp care are available for all age groups from 8-9a.m. and 5-6p.m. for \$25 per child per week.

For students taking both a morning and afternoon session a supervised lunch period is available. Students need to bring a sack lunch as well as the snacks for both sessions.

Evening Major Productions

Reserve your space by calling PCT and paying a \$35 non-refundable registration fee. The balance of tuition may be paid in two installments after casting has been announced. If an actor must drop out of the production, prorated tuition will be held on account for use towards future classes or productions.

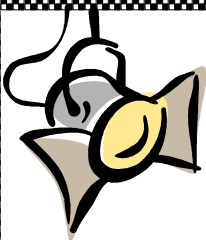

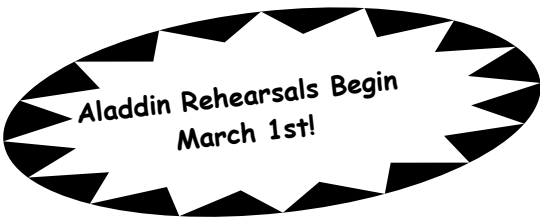
